The United States of America informs the Court that

COUNT ONE: Unauthorized Computer Access [18 U.S.C. § 1030(a)(2)(B)]

From on or about June 22, 2004, and continuing though on or about July 15, 2004, in the District of Columbia, the defendant, WILLIAM A. CELEY, intentionally accessed a computer without authorization and exceeded his authorized access to that computer, and thereby obtained information from a department and agency of the United States; that is, defendant CELEY, while a contract employee of the U.S. Department of State, accessed the federal agency's Passport Information Electronic Records System (PIERS) database without authorization and obtained information from the State Department pertaining to the imaged confidential passport application files of various celebrities and their families, actors, models, musicians, athletes, record producers, family members, a politician, and other individuals identified in the press.

All in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1030(a)(2)(B) and (c)(2)(A) (Class A Misdemeanor).
